Board of Directors:

This encompasses actively participating in strategic planning and making policy decisions to ensure ethical animal welfare, that there are human resources in place to accomplish the mission of LAPS and the ongoing monitoring of the execution of the strategic plan. The Board is accountable for LAPS' performance, base on the standards it establishes, and for ensuring that the organization develops the capacity to meet those standards.
